



WEEK 10

The college football season enters the final weeks, many teams jockeying for a spot in a Bowl game or a playoff seed. Many Canadian student-athletes hope to be a big part of that success.

North Dakota improved to 5-4 following a 30-24 win over Southern Oregon. The Raiders held a commanding 17-3 lead near the end of the first half, but a fumble on the kick return allowed the Fighting Sioux to tie the game 17-17 before the end of the half. North Dakota receiver Ismael Bamba (Montreal, QC) was targeted 15 times, coming down with eight catches for 88 yards and a touchdown. Four of the catches came on one drive late in the second quarter culminating in a touchdown. The St. Leonards alum ran the ball once for three yards and had two kick returns for 43 yards. Linebacker Curtis Dublanko (Thorsby, AB) did his part on defense with six tackles and a sack. This is the 600th win for the program's history.

Tulsa took a heartbreaking loss to No. 12 Houston 46-45. After leading 45-36 in the final minute of the game, the Cougars scored twice off a field goal and a touchdown in the final 22 seconds of the game. Golden Hurricanes tackle Tyler Holmes (Ottawa, ON) started as the offense amassed 534 yards in the contest.

Despite 35 points in the second half, the Huskies could not catch No. 4 Cincinnati losing 47-45. The Huskies offense racked up 201 rushing yards with Muhammed Petrus (St. Laurent, ON) at center. Jesse Joseph contributed two tackles on defense. Tight end John Delahunt (Ottawa, ON) saw limited action.

New Hampshire moved to 8-1 with another win over Rhode Island. Corner Ryan Hinds (Toronto, ON) continues to be stellar for the Wildcats finishing with five tackles and three passes deflected.

Offensive tackle Jack Range (Ottawa, ON) and California University faced off against Shippensburg in the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference Title Game. The Vulcans racked up 446 total yards on offense but still lost 42-35.

Southern Arkansas remained undefeated, at 6-0, with a victory over 64-12. Quarterback Myles Gibbon (Montreal, QC) completed two of five pass attempts for 33 yards. The freshman also rushed three times for 59 yards and a touchdown.

Harvard opened up with a 21-0 halftime lead against Columbia to win 32-14. Receiver Marco Iannuzzi (Calgary, AB) snagged five catches for 35 yards and returned two punts for 17 yards.

Akron held Kent State to only 38 rushing yards in a 28-20 win. Zips defensive end Hasan Hazime (Pickering, ON) collected four tackles in the game.

Georgetown got clipped on the road in a 23-21 loss to Marist. Hoyas running back had nine carries on 22 yards, five catches for 28 yards, and four kick returns for 63 yards.

Michigan dropped their third straight contest, this time at home against Purdue, 38-36. The Wolverines had a chance to tie the game with a late two-point conversion, but the rush attempt came up short. Defensive lineman Renaldo Sagesse (Montreal, QC) made one tackle.

Boise State moved up to No. 6 in BCS Rankings with a 45-35 triumph over Louisiana Tech. Broncos defensive lineman Michael Atkinson (Windsor, ON) made a tackle in their ninth win of the season.

Duke corner Chris Rwabukamba (Windsor, ON) recorded four tackles and broke up a pass in a 19-6 loss to North Carolina.

Eastern Michigan linebacker Andy Mulumba (Montreal, QC) gathered five tackles in a 50-6 loss.

Adrian lost 21-16 in a road loss to Trine. Bulldogs Kevin Allaer (Wallaceburg, ON) had four punts for 134 yards, downing three inside the 20.

Idaho State linebacker Nic Edgson (West Vancouver, BC) made one tackle in a 12-10 loss to Montana.

Northeastern State corner Troy Adams (Toronto, ON) deflected one pass in a 47-38 shootout loss to Central Oklahoma.

In a 20-7 win over Earlham, Ohio Wesleyan defensive back Kyle Karczynski (Caledonia, ON) made two tackles.

In a blowout 43-17 win over Citadel, Wofford defensive lineman Ameet Pall (Montreal, QC) had three tackles.
