



While playing on Halloween, college teams hoped to avoid any in-game horrors. In the spirit of the holiday weekend, many Canadians provided plenty of treats for their respective teams.

After trailing 17-7 midway into the second quarter against Cal Poly, North Dakota's offense kicked it into high gear scoring 24-unanswered points to finish on top, 31-17. Fighting Sioux receiver Ismael Bamba (Montreal, QC) turned in another productive performance with seven catches for 104 yards, along with two carries for 14 yards, and two kick returns for 23 yards. Linebacker Curtis Dublanko (Thorsby, AB) came away with an interception in the fourth to seal the win. The six-foot junior also had a fumble recovery along with two tackles. Brett Cameron (Winnipeg, MB) punted only once for 55 yards downing inside the 20.

Missouri S&T picked up their third straight win by defeating Lincoln University, 35-14. The Miners opened up with a 19-0 lead, allowing starting running back Jerome Miller roll for 91 yards on 16 carries.

Georgetown running back Charlie Houghton (Toronto, ON) had a standout game carrying the ball 19 times for 112 yards, two catches for 15 yards, and five kick returns for 122 yards. Despite the first 100-yard rushing performance of the Hoyas' season, Old Dominion dominated on the ground to win 31-10.

Connecticut had a victory snatched away in the final minute by Rutgers, 28-24. After coming back to take a 24-21 lead in the final minute of the fourth quarter, the Rutgers took one play to go 81 yards to retake the lead and steal a win. The Huskies had little trouble moving the ball, racking up 481 yards, but committed three turnovers. Center Muhammed Petrus (St. Laurent, QC) and defensive end Jesse Joseph (Laval, QC) both started for the Huskies. The freshman Joseph finished with five tackles and one sack. Tight end John Delahunt (Ottawa, ON) saw some playing time in the game.

California University clinched the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) West Title for the third straight year, fifth overall, with a 28-7 over Mercyhurst. Offensive lineman Jack Range (Ottawa, ON) started for the Vulcans offense that amassed 392 total yards. California University will play Shippensburg for the PSAC championship.

Southern Arkansas remains undefeated in their inaugural season with a 64-6 blowout victory against Fort Union (Va.) Military Academy. Quarterback Myles Gibbon (Montreal, QC) ended the game completing two of four pass attempts for 124 yards, both completions going for touchdowns.

Central Michigan stumbled in a 31-10 road loss to Boston College. Chippewas safety Eric Fraser (Burnaby, BC) collected six tackles and broke up a pass. Receiver Kito Poblah (Montreal, QC) was held to only three catches for 29 yards.

New Hampshire improved to 7-1 on the season with a 48-21 triumph of Northeastern. Wildcats corner Ryan Hinds (Toronto, ON) accumulated five tackles and deflected two passes.

Nevada continues to run over opponents, this time rushing for 312 yards in a 31-21 win over Hawaii. Offensive lineman John Bender (Cochrane, AB) started for the Wildcats.

Akron suffered a 27-10 loss to Northern Illinois. Zips defensive lineman Hasan Hazime (Pickering, ON) made six tackles and blocked a field goal attempt.

In a 28-17 victory over Virginia, Duke corner Chris Rwabukamba (Windsor, ON) gathered four tackles and broke up two passes.

Wofford took a 34-6 loss at the hands of Elon. Terriers defensive lineman Ameet Pall (Montreal, QC) amassed six tackles and a sack.

Adrian pulled out a 7-0 home win over Alma. Bulldogs punter Kevin Allaer (Wallaceburg, ON) made six punts for 247 yards, downing three inside the 20.

Charleston Southern defensive lineman Chris Parris (Toronto, ON) tackled two ball carriers in a 31-21 win at VMI.

Eastern Michigan was downed by Arkansas 63-27. Eagles linebacker Andy Mulumba (Montreal, QC) had one tackle in the contest. Fullback Corey Watman (Queensland, ON) received the start on offense.

Howard University linebacker Jean-Mary Patrick (Montreal, QC) racked up three tackles and had one quarterback hurry.

Ohio Wesleyan defensive back Kyle Karczynski (Caledonia, ON) recorded four tackles in a blowout 38-6 victory versus Hiram.

Northeastern State could not keep up with West Texas A&M losing 66-23. Riverhawks corner Troy Adams (Toronto, ON) finished with four tackles in the game.

Wagner College linebacker Carl-Olivier Prime (Quebec, CA) recovered a fumble in a double overtime win 23-17 over Duquesne.
