THE 2009 IFAF WORLD JUNIOR CHAMPIONSHIPS TO BE BROADCAST LIVE ON-LINE

Montreal, June 25, 2009 – For the first time live video coverage is available for the 2009 IFAF World Junior Championships. Football Canada confirmed today that all games will be carried live on-line. Canada, led by head coach Glen Constantin, is the tournament's top-seed.

Canada's first two games, both against New Zealand, can be viewed at www.jwcfootball.com on June 27 at 10 a.m. (EDT), and July 1 at 10 a.m., or 4 p.m.

Fox College Sports picks-up the feed the rest of the way to broadcast the medal round games on July 4-5 at FoxCollegeSports.com

The gold medal game is scheduled for July 5 at 1 p.m., while the bronze medal game is on July 4 at 7 p.m. All games are scheduled for Fawcett Stadium in Canton, Ohio, home of the Football Hall of Fame.

The under-20 tournament pits eight national teams from four continents. The participating countries are Canada, the United States, Mexico, Germany, Sweden, France, Japan and New Zealand.
